It is my honor and privilege to continue the strategic legacy that has been the framework of MDI Hospital's success. With donors and friends like you as our valued partners, I thank you for being part of the Hospital's journey.

Healthcare facilities all over the world continue to navigate the unprecedented challenge of COVID-19. I would like to acknowledge the community members – both within MDI Hospital, and those beyond our walls – who are working together to mitigate the effects of COVID-19 in our isolated region. The Downeast COVID-19 Task Force has united local stakeholders, nonprofits, and small business owners in a highly effective mechanism for pandemic response. We are grateful for the many philanthropic supporters who have donated significant funds to MDI Hospital this past year, helping us deliver vital healthcare, up-to-the-minute guidance, COVID-19 tests, PPE, vaccinations, and educational materials.

MDI Hospital strives to be a leader in improving the health and vibrancy of our patients and the community we serve through innovation and improved integrated systems

of care. In my first year as President and CEO, I am eager to see two important projects coming to fruition.



The Hospital will complete acquisition and installation of the state-of-the-art Philips Ingenia Ambition MRI system, to be fully contained within the walls of our main Hospital building. This major project is designed to greatly improve and increase medical diagnostic services for patients, while streamlining workflow for our Medical Imaging staff. This is a profound step forward for the region's medical imaging needs, placing one of Maine's most advanced MRI units in our coastal district. As the last independent hospital in our catchment area, acquisition of this system continues MDI Hospital's proud tradition of providing highest-quality diagnostics and healthcare for residents of eastern Maine with a superior experience.

Over the past decade, MDI Hospital has established internships and residencies with educational partners like Tufts University School of Medicine, the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania, Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University, The Jackson Laboratory, Penn Medicine, Maine Medical Center, University of New England, University of Maine, St. Joseph's College, and College of the Atlantic. The Hospital's Medical Education program

introduces the next generation of caregivers to the rewards of rural healthcare, ensuring our ability to recruit and retain high-quality staff members in the face of looming shortages of rural medicine providers.

Recognizing the importance of this growing initiative, Robert and Arlene Kogod of Washington, D.C. and Seal Harbor have provided major support to construct the Kogod Family Center for Medical Education. The Kogod Center will anchor the future of MDI Hospital's Medical Education program with centralized student housing and meeting space. Aspiring doctors, physician's assistants, nurses, behavioral and music therapists, pharmacists, and other professionals will pass through this building's doors as they learn about community healthcare in the best possible place – with dedicated mentors, and a welcoming population of patients and neighbors. The Kogod Center will be constructed using green building and architecture standards on our main campus in Bar Harbor. I look forward to updating you on these important projects in the months to come.

The future of healthcare is promising, and I am optimistic and encouraged as I take on my new responsibilities at MDI Hospital. Our Hospital has led the way in pursuing whole-person, community-centered, integrated medicine, building a bridge from healthcare to wellness care. 
Dr. Stuart Davidson Maintains Patient-Centered Focus as Chief Medical Officer at MDI Hospital

Dr. Stuart (Stu) Davidson, MD serves Mount Desert Island Hospital as both Chief Medical Officer (CMO) and as a board-certified general orthopedist, treating a broad spectrum of musculoskeletal issues. Only the second person to hold the CMO title at MDI Hospital, Dr. Davidson became CMO in June 2017 following the retirement of Dr. Edward Gilmore, bringing to the position his prior experience as MDI Hospital's medical staff president. As a liaison between medical staff, Hospital administration, and the Hospital's Board of Trustees, his role includes staff recruitment, development and revision of medical care protocols, promotion of ethical standards, effective and improved use of medical technology, and the evaluation and resolution of patient and staff concerns.

After receiving his medical degree from Boston University and completing a surgical internship and orthopedic residency at Georgetown University, Dr. Davidson spent most of his career in the Washington, D.C. area, operating in a large practice with five other orthopedic surgeons. Reminded that he had always envisioned himself caring for a much smaller population, he developed a private practice on the eastern Virginia shore, working with rural fishing and farming communities. These close doctor-patient relationships became the most meaningful to him, and so Dr. Davidson decided to further pursue rural-focused healthcare.

Recalling his love for the Pine Tree State, Dr. Davidson began to seek out available orthopedic positions in the area, eventually leading to a prospective posting in Bar Harbor. Dr. Davidson joined MDI Hospital in 2010 and seamlessly slid into the lifestyle of our rural, island community. In his free time, he enjoys woodworking, running, softball, and biking.

At MDI Orthopedics, the Hospital's full-service orthopedic and sports medicine clinic, Dr. Davidson provides state-of-the-art evaluation and treatment of sports injuries, disorders of the joints, bones, and associated muscles as well as surgical and consultative support to our Emergency Department, providing the highest standard of orthopedic



care for adult and pediatric patients. Dr. Davidson's practice is founded on achieving excellence in orthopedic surgery, demonstrating integrity in physician-patient relationships, providing prompt service and compassionate care for patients, and promoting wellness as a priority in life.

Practicing medicine in a small, close-knit community, Dr. Davidson noted that, "every patient has an impact on what we do and how it affects us." A patient that Dr. Davidson treated in the Emergency Department recently led him to reconnect with his professor of Orthopedic Surgery at Boston University. "[I] had a long discussion with him about how [he] ultimately affected the direction of my life," Dr. Davidson recalled, ultimately culminating in his patient-centered practice in rural Maine.

With patients being his highest priority, Dr. Davidson highlighted the steps the Hospital has taken to minimize the effects of the COVID-19 crisis on healthcare procedures: "Necessary modifications have been made [to ensure patient and staff safety], however, accessibility to care remains widely available. Adequate testing and screening are consistently practiced to keep staff and the community at large as safe as possible. Any patients considering hospital services should pursue them as needed."

COVID-19 and Vaccination Rollout Update

Mount Desert Island Hospital administered its first vaccinations for COVID-19 to frontline healthcare staff in late December, followed by a limited supply of doses designated for frontline and community healthcare workers and older adults living in congregate care facilities. As MDI Hospital and our community eagerly await an increase in national and state vaccine supply, we are following state and federal guidelines for a phased approach to providing vaccines that prioritize the most vulnerable in our community.

Governor Janet Mills announced updates to Maine's vaccine distribution strategy on January 13, 2021 that prioritizes older residents, those with underlying conditions, emergency service personnel, and others critical to Maine's COVID-19 response. The updated strategy also focuses on adults of all ages with underlying medical conditions that place them at greater risk of serious illness or death from COVID-19.

Current priorities in Maine Phase 1a include health-care workers, EMS, and residents of long-term care facilities. Phase 1b includes people age 70 and older and front-line essential workers. Phase 1c includes people ages 65-70, people of all ages with high-risk medical conditions, and other essential workers. Phase 2 includes all people ages 16 and older who are not in Phase 1, with vaccine starting to become available to the general public. This approach is subject to change as Maine updates vaccination priorities and strategy in accordance with federal guidelines.

MDI Hospital is now offering preregistration to those in our region who qualify to receive the COVID-19 vaccination in the State of Maine. Due to the limited supply of vaccine, a timeline for available doses cannot be provided. Those who complete the form will be contacted when a dose becomes available for them.

As of February 1,2021, MDI Hospital has administered 1,234 doses of vaccine. This includes 825 first doses and 409 second doses. Currently, our hospital is receiving zero to 200 doses each week and we have more than 6,000 people preregistered to receive the vaccine when doses become available. Per state guidelines, we are focused on phase 1a



and 1b, which prioritize the oldest in our community, those with high-risk medical conditions, and health care workers.

Community members will be notified in a variety of ways when vaccine is more widely available – including public announcements, website postings, and information at providers' offices and clinics. There are many vaccination clinics across Maine that you may be able to access. At MDI Hospital, our preregistration process is still the best way to ensure that you will be contacted when a dose becomes available for you. Bar Harbor Bank & Trust Supports COVID-19 Testing Program for Island Schools

Bar Harbor Bank & Trust demonstrated outstanding support for the Mount Desert Island community with a \$37,400 grant to support MDI Hospital's COVID-19 testing initiative, developed in concert with the Downeast COVID-19 Task Force. Bar Harbor Bank & Trust's grant is targeted to benefit the Mount Desert Island Regional School System (AOS 91) as they strive to keep students, staff, and, schools healthy and safe.

"We are so grateful to Bar Harbor Bank & Trust for their leadership support of this high-quality, evidence-based COVID-19 testing program for our Island schools," said Chrissi Maguire, President/CEO of MDI Hospital. "Their commitment to this important initiative is helping to ensure that our schools stay on track during this pandemic."

Beginning in November 2020, 500 staff members were tested initially to establish a baseline and detect any existing cases, followed by weekly sentinel testing of staff in pre-established cohorts to continue through June 2021. The AOS 91 tests are conducted by MDI Hospital personnel and processed by Cambridge Innovation Center (CIC) Health, an incubator for innovative start-up and testing facilities. CIC collaborates with 100+ organizations throughout the United States, conducting some 4,000 tests daily. CIC Health is a founding partner of the Assurance Testing Alliance, a collaboration of professional organizations working to streamline and lower the costs of COVID-19 testing.

"Bar Harbor Bank & Trust is passionate about supporting the communities we serve, especially MDI which has been our home for more than 130 years. Ensuring the safety of our schools has a significant positive impact to the entire community, and proactive efforts like this testing program will help limit the spread of COVID-19 throughout MDI. We are honored to help support this partnership between MDI Hospital and AOS 91 to help keep our kids, teachers, and neighbors safe," said Curtis Simard, President and CEO of Bar Harbor Bank & Trust.

An additional grant of \$40,000 to support the AOS 91 testing initiative has been received from the Rural Health Hospital Program for expanding testing in rural communities. Thanks to these generous donations, the tests are being conducted at no cost to district employees, and with no impact on current school budgets. "This testing program will be used to monitor our schools for evidence of community spread of COVID-19 in concert with current mitigation strategies," explained Marc Gousse, PhD, Superintendent of the AOS 91 Mount Desert Regional School System. As of January 29, 2021, this program has yielded one positive result out of 751 total tests completed.

The Downeast COVID-19 Task Force was established in the early days of the pandemic to explore community-based solutions and provide a forum for discussion of ongoing challenges around COVID-19 testing, contact tracing, and education. Current members include area town and chamber of commerce leaders, local legislators and leadership from MDI Hospital, Healthy Acadia, the Jackson Laboratory, Mount Desert Island Regional School System, College of the Atlantic and Acadia National Park.
