Fiscal Year 2022 Highlights



Dental student Emily Leach (pictured below) is one of the many medical education students who trained at MDI Hospital in fiscal year 2022. Each year, students from Penn Medicine, Tufts University, University of New England, Brown University, Maine Medical Center, Massachusetts General Hospital, and more come to MDI Hospital to experience deeply enriching rotations in rural medicine.



MDI Hospital's new MRI unit scanned its first patient on November 1, 2021. Not only does the installation bring lifesaving technology to the Downeast region, but it is also one of Maine's most advanced MRI units. The Philips Ingenia Ambition MRI system features near-silent technology, faster scan times and patientadjustable lighting, image projections and soundscapes.





MDI Hospital received a \$22,434 grant from the Northeast Delta Dental Foundation, supporting the acquisition of two Airflow Prophylaxis Master Premium units for our Community Dental Center (CDC). These units utilizes a novel protocol to remove biofilm above and below the gumline, before it triggers an immune response.

MDI Hospital and Health Centers launched a new electronic health record system on March 7, 2022. The Cerner CommunityWorks platform replaced multiple legacy systems and provides patients with a streamlined and secure way to manage their health and wellness information electronically. The new Cerner EHR has all the information for an individual patient on one platform instead of in three separate applications.



MDI Hospital and Birch Bay Retirement Village employees donated over \$30,000 in support of the Lani K. Naihe and Luzvie E. Estacio Memorial MRI Wing, which was named in memory of two members of the MDI Hospital family that were lost to glioblastoma, an aggressive form of brain cancer.





In early 2022, our registration area was moved in order to create additional space for our Emergency Department. This project allowed us to better care for our community as we plan for critically needed expansion and renovation.



Planning throughout fiscal year 2022 resulted in a groundbreaking for the Kogod Center for Medical Education on August 18, 2022. The center, made possible by Robert and Arlene Kogod and their children, Lauren, Leslie and Stuart, will provide critical housing and conference space for visiting medical students and residents from top colleges and universities.

A Hand to Hold: Care in a Crisis

The past two years challenged our community with uncertainties that far surpassed anything previously thought possible. Since March 2020, we experienced lockdowns, masking, and social distancing previously rare words that are now commonplace in our vocabulary. Despite everything, we managed to come together in creative, new ways and realized that sometimes, above all else, you just need someone to be there for you and hold your hand.

When Klair Moshier and her husband, Scott, walked through the



doors of the Emergency Department at Mount Desert Island Hospital in December 2021, doctors were immediately concerned and tested Klair's oxygen saturation levels. "Most people with normal lung function are operating somewhere around 98+ percent. She was 53 percent," noted Dr. Peter Ossanna, Chief of Medicine and Hospitalist who treated Klair. "She was critically ill."

Within 45 minutes of arrival, Klair was admitted and placed on a ventilator in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) with a severe case of COVID-19. Doctors were baffled as to how she even walked into the hospital of her own volition with some of the worst lungs they had ever seen. Scott also had COVID-19, but his symptoms were far less severe. Due to the strict visitation protocols in place at the time, Scott was sent home to recover while Klair remained hospitalized.

As he drove away, Scott was struck by the need to be near his wife. He told MDI Hospital staff that he couldn't just wait at home, so he turned around and came back. Scott spent all the time he could in his truck in the parking lot right outside Klair's window, where nurses would wave and assure him that she was in good hands.

In the ICU, Monica Theroux, RN was one of the nurses who cared for Klair. "She was really sick, and we were worried about her," recalled Monica. As one of the first COVID-19 patients that Monica had treated, she was concerned for her own health and safety as well, but she knew she couldn't show any of that to the patient. "You have to provide reassurance and make them feel safe."

Scott stayed in constant communication with Klair's nurses while he waited outside. "I would put the phone to Klair's ear and say, 'just talk, I don't know if she can hear you but she's here," recalled Lisa Mc-Laggan, RN. "I told him, if you want to call throughout the night, I'm here until 7 in the morning so call every couple of hours."


"You're here to be their support, not just medical, because it's not just medical that heals you," said Maddrey Coover, RN, BSN. "Especially with COVID-19 patients, that isolation creates a need for communication and connection."

Klair was ultimately on the ventilator in the ICU for five days. "It was a big wake up call for life in general and what's important. At the end of the day, it's who you're next to," said Scott.

"My nurses were the most amazing...I don't even call them people—they are angels on earth." Klair recalls only being able to see their eyes, but she remembers their stories and their kind words. "They would go above and beyond every single time. Just before they left my room, they would ask, 'is there anything else I can get for you or do for you?' And every time I said, 'would you just hold my hand?' They would come over to the bedside and I was so grateful. They never rushed. They were happy to sit and hold my hand. They would talk to me and tell me I was going to be ok."

"They saved my life. It's as simple as that. I'm here today because of MDI Hospital."

Klair and Scott both recovered from COVID-19 and continue to be monitored by the healthcare team at MDI Hospital.

Sally loves both her own family, and her BBRV family. She also became a death doula in June 2020.






