The Annual UPenn Continuing
Medical Education Conference was
held this spring, drawing healthcare
professionals from the region and
beyond to learn from the Hospital of the
University of Pennsylvania team. This
year's conference focused on trauma
including scenarios of blunt trauma,
head trauma, domestic violence, and the
psychological aspects of trauma.



The Community Dental Center has significantly upgraded their dental services by acquiring a Fastscan.io Intraoral Scanner: a lightweight, slender, wand-shaped device which captures direct optical impressions of a patient's oral cavity by painlessly projecting a light source onto the area to be scanned. This advance was made possible by a grant from the Northeast Delta Dental Foundation. Medical Imaging also upgraded their CT Scanner with state-of-the-art technology.

The Kogod Center for Medical Education broke ground this year, with construction set to be completed in early 2024. This donor-funded, state-of-theart facility will be complete with dining, meeting, and living space for medical education students and residents.



The Mount Desert Island Behavioral Health Center participated in a broadbased community outreach effort to raise awareness around mental health and well-being for all ages, with special attention to 12-20-year-olds, an increasingly vulnerable age range in our region.



The Northeast Harbor Clinic opened last summer after extensive renovations, and was celebrated with a ribbon cutting. This clinic offers year-round primary care and is open three and a half days a week.

Every Minute Counts: How a Caring Community Saved Jeff Dobbs' Life

The holiday season was just beginning as Karen Sharpe and her mother, Eddy Nichols, sat together at her kitchen counter in Bar Harbor, writing Christmas cards. Karen's husband Jeff Dobbs was sitting alongside on a stool. Suddenly, Karen's mother heard what she thought was an explosion...but was, in fact, Jeff falling to the floor. "He's a big guy," Eddy recalls, "and as he hit the floor, the whole house shook. I was terrified." Jeff was working on an e-mail, and he just went down, Karen explains. "For whatever reason, I didn't panic. My mother said call 911, so I did."

These were the first intense moments of a multilayered, tightly coordinated medical effort that saved Jeff's life. Responders were on the scene within minutes, but be-

fore they arrived, Karen bravely undertook CPR. Bar Harbor police officer Doug Brundrett was the first on the scene, and he and Karen continued CPR together. The EMS team was next to arrive, moving furniture out of the way and applying a LUCAS chest compressor. Volunteer firefighter Matt Horton and family friend Renee Graves had heard the scanner announcement and rushed to the house to assist.

Dr. Nate Donaldson, the attending physician in MDI Hospital's Emergency Department that day, had already assembled a team that was anxiously awaiting Jeff's arrival. "EMS paramedics picked him up and they were able to return Jeff to spontaneous circulation. In the ED, we were able to intubate him and eventual-

ly got him stabilized," he explains. The MDI Hospital team then worked quickly to ensure a well-coordinated transfer to Northern Light Eastern Maine Medical Center. "From the moment he arrived to the moment he was transferred by Life Flight was a true example of how our outstanding ED works together to give the best quality of care to our patients," says Vicky Eaton, RN, ED Nursing Supervisor.

Jeff's recollection of events after his heart attack begins a couple of months after his extended hospitalization. "My wife had a very difficult time because they gave me no chance for survival. And, boy, am I glad I showed them up on that one." He remembers being challenged by intubation protocols, four-hour checks, blood tests, and intense medications.

Jeff was released from Northern Light EMMC in mid-winter and began his long recovery process at MDI Hospital. Sarah MacEachern, RN, is his Cardiac Rehabilitation provider. "He was a little concerned about how much he'd be able to do, so we just take it slow...the first time he was able, we did 5 minutes on the treadmill and that was exhausting, so we did a couple of other seated exercises at the time. You just have to take it step by step." Jeff's strong recovery is even more remarkable considering his other chronic conditions: he receives dialysis three times a week, has Type 2 diabetes, and is a cancer survivor.

Jeff's story clearly illustrates how MDI Hospital and our supporting community are interlocked, looking out for each other. Every caregiver who assisted Jeff knew him well: as a Town Councilor and as a longtime film documentarian who has captured the Island's way of life for countless viewers on PBS and elsewhere. Karen Sharpe, too, has been an Island resident for decades and is beloved by many—including Dr. Donaldson's daughter—as a caring schoolteacher.

Jeff first moved to MDI as a boy in 1955. He has vivid memories of past visits to the hospital for childhood ills like tonsillitis, not to mention his more recent health concerns.

Vicky fondly remembers Jeff's return to Island life in February. "The first time I saw him it was very difficult to hold back tears. I think I speak for many in healthcare who often don't get to see folks when they have recovered from a traumatic event. In this case, it's a true reminder of why I am a nurse."

Both Jeff and Karen credit the coordinated community efforts of his MDI Hospital caregivers, local EMS, and Northern Light EMMC for helping him beat the odds. "This may sound strange," Karen summarizes, "but it just feels like time could never have felt so wonderful if it hadn't been for the fact that I almost lost Jeff. It's like we have a second part of our lives. We are both overjoyed to be able to look forward to what's ahead of us."

MDI Opiate Task Force

The MDI Opiate Task Force, led by Bar Harbor Fire Department Deputy Chief John Lennon, has held several free, public Narcan training sessions in the last year in response to the growing opioid crisis that Maine is experiencing. These training sessions teach individuals the signs of an overdose and how to use the lifesaving drug. In support of this work, Bar Harbor Fire Department became a registered tier-two naloxone distributor in October of 2022; since then, the group has distributed over 300 doses of naloxone to community members who can then use it to save a life in the event of an overdose. This award is in recognition of their first-hand, boots on the ground approach to this growing behavioral health need on MDI, and the dedication of its members to the safety of those battling addiction.


